Purpose:

1. To learn how to use a social bookmarking application such as Delicious
2. To learn how to send someone a bookmark (sharing)
3. To learn how to see other’s bookmarks in a “network” (sharing)

Procedure

1. Set up an account on Delicious (unless you already have one)
 - your user name will be part of your Web address (ie: <http://delicious.com/csit70>)
2. Bookmark 2 or 3 (more if you wish) sites that pertain to some aspect of Web 2.0
3. **Send one bookmark to me – for:csit70**
4. Please put your name in the “notes” section of the bookmark so I know who you are
5. I will create a network of users on <http://www.delicious.com/csit70> so that you may all be able to see and share bookmarks, if you wish to use this feature
6. See the class handout and videos to learn more about using Delicious
